August Meeting – Demo by Babs Steward:

When using pastel, Babs works on tinted paper, which will remain visible around the painted areas in the finished painting. She begins establishing the image by drawing shadows, starting with the darkest and working toward the adjacent areas. She likes to push beyond local color and she uses a test strip of her paper to see how colors will appear on that paper.

She uses her darkest shades of blue, green or violet to rough in the dark areas. "This acts as an anchor." She likes to use a 2/5, 3/5 ratio in landscapes. She uses three shades to create mass and likes to work loose, quoting Karen Margulis' directive "don't draw -- suggest." The background color will show through in places. She didn't use much layering, but applies the color in broad strokes with the side of the pastel stick. She especially likes Schmincke pastels.

She concluded by quoting Paul Gardiner: "A painting is never finished. It just stops in interesting places."

Members brought their mini-paintings from our recent challenge to share with the group:
